Free Three-day Worker Occupational Safety and Health (WOSH) Specialist Training

The Worker Occupational Safety and Health (WOSH) Specialist training program is a statewide effort aimed at reducing job-related injuries and illnesses among California workers. The program was created as part of the workers' compensation reform and is administered by California's Commission on Health and Safety and Workers' Compensation (CHSWC) in the Department of Industrial Relations.

At this hands-on, interactive, and stimulating three-day training, you will be introduced to basic occupational health & safety concepts and learn how to take a leadership role in promoting health & safety at your workplace. You will receive a free health and safety course binder, a chance to share ideas and strategies with employees from other workplaces, and a certificate of completion as a WOSH Specialist.

- Identifying and Controlling Hazards
- Safety Rights and Responsibilities
- Workers' Compensation
- Cal/OSHA
- Strategies for Taking Action
- Health and Safety Committees
- Ergonomics

The course is presented by instructors at UC Berkeley's Labor Occupational Health Program (LOHP).
